-Please do not park directly in front of the school from 7:40 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.. This is for bus loading and unloading and needs to be kept open in case of an emergency. Please drop off/pick up students in the designated drop off area by the flag pole or in the parking lot.

Pools and hot tub closed in August

We want you to know that the pools will be closed starting Aug. 4-27.



The pools have not had a lot of repairs over the years and it is time for us to do so. We have funds from the past referendum that we must use for the repairs and August is the best time of the year for us to do this work.

The lap pool will be acid washed to bring out the stains and to give it a fresh look. We will have areas touched up and repaired as needed. We also plan to replace the safety grates at the bottom of the lap pool while the pool is drained. The caulk at the bottom of the pool also is in need of replacement.

The leisure or "kiddie" pool will have the floor completely replaced to solve the floor problems we have had. The floor has been chipping up and this needs to be resolved. This work will give the pool a new clean look. The cross section next to the slide will also be repaired with new tile added.

The safety grates at the bottom of the leisure pool will also be replaced at that time. The water slide has an end cap that is in need of repainting and repair, and we will have that work and a full inspection of the slide completed so it is ready to go.

The hot tub will be completely retiled so it has a new fresh look. The tiles will be slip resistant and the safety grate at the bottom of the hot tub will be replaced at that time. This will give a new fresh look to that highly popular area.

We know this can be a bit of an inconvenience to some, but August is the slowest month we have in our facility. It is also a great month for many of you to swim in the lakes for a work out.

The Fitness Center will be always open for you to use the cardio area and weights. Thank you for your cooperation as we continue to keep our wonderful facility in prime condition for you and the thousands that use it annually.

Schedules for middle and high school students are available for viewing in Skyward.

If you do not have a Skyward account or have forgotten your login information please contact the school for assistance. Schedule changes will only be made if there is a clerical error, classes need to be added, or a prior class failure necessitates a change.

If you have questions about your schedule please contact the counseling office.

The middle and high school building will be implementing a new daily schedule for the 2017-18 school year. Classes will begin at 8:05 a.m. and conclude at 3:21 p.m.

Eight class periods will run for 43 minutes each. The TREK (Toward Rigor, Relevance, Enrichment and Knowledge) intervention period will continue to be held at the end of the day.

This daily schedule will be implemented by the ERVING (Embarrass River Valley Instructional Network Group) distance education consortium in the 2018-19 school year.

As a member of this consortium, the Iola-Scandinavia School District decided to make the change starting this year. This will allow our students to enroll in an ERVING

class without having to miss out on courses offered in our district.

This schedule will also add some instructional time to each class period and instructional minutes to each day school is in session.

As you may know, the State of Wisconsin requires that a minimum of 1,137 hours of instruction must be provided to students in grades 7-12 each year.

By increasing our daily time schedule by 12 minutes we are providing additional instructional time while also reducing the need to add days at the end of the school year to make up for time missed due to inclement weather.

If you have questions about this new daily schedule please feel free to call or stop in to meet with me.

The fall sports programs will be starting soon. High school football begins on Aug. 1, while cross-country, volleyball and boys soccer begin on Aug. 14.

Coaches will provide information regarding the start of Middle School cross-country, football, and volleyball.

Students interested in participating on an athletic team can search the website for information or contact the respective coaches.

All students wishing to participate need to have a current physical card on file prior to being allowed to take part in any practice sessions. Forms are available on a bulletin board outside of the high school office or from coaches.
