Iola, WI – 7/18/17 – The Iola-Scandinavia School District is the recent recipient of a \$13,150 grant from the Wisconsin Technology Initiative to help reduce the financial barriers of integrating instructional technology in Iola-Scandinavia school district classrooms.

The district will be installing 10 Epson short throw projectors with in-ceiling audio to narrow the technology gap in classrooms. In the LMC (Library Media Center) a mobile SMART Panel will be used for collaboration in the LMC and/or classrooms.
