

EVALUATION OF THE INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM

As part of its continuing effort to evaluate the district's instructional program, the instructional staff, under the direction of the Elementary School Principal/Director of Curriculum and Instruction, will review and evaluate programs every five years in accordance with the District's long range plan.

Other means for evaluation of the district's instructional program may include:

1. Testing programs such as nationally standardized general achievement tests, national standardized tests in specific subject areas and tests administered or provided by other agencies such as competency tests.
2. The study of school achievement records.
3. The study of dropout records.
4. Teacher and parent/guardian evaluation of student behaviors.
5. Department of Public Instruction (DPI) specialists and services.

An evaluation of the instructional program and its effectiveness shall be made periodically and reported to the Board by the District Administrator.

The Iola-Scandinavia Long-Range Plan shall be reviewed and approved on an annual basis.
