SCHOOL ADMISSIONS

Any student being admitted to the School District of Iola-Scandinavia must reside within the established boundaries of the district, except as otherwise provided. The administration shall verify the age and residence of children enrolling in district schools.

Students transferring from other school systems or home-based private educational programs shall be required to provide a transcript of academic accomplishments at the previous school or program, or the address from which this data may be secured. If sufficient academic transcript information is not available, a student may be evaluated by the building principal, or his/her designee, for proper grade placement.

Grade placement of transfer students shall be the responsibility of the building principal. In general, transfer students shall be placed in their grade level at the time of transfer. Transfer students may be placed in a higher or lower grade on the basis of their general achievement and mental, physical, emotional and social maturity.

Students admitted to district's schools shall present immunization records as required by law. Each student entering kindergarten shall be asked to provide evidence that the student has had his/her eyes examined by a licensed optometrist or evaluated by a licensed physician. Students complying with this request must provide evidence of an eye examination or evaluation in accordance with the timeline established in state law. The district also requests physical and dental exams for students.

The district may deny the enrollment of a student during his/her term of expulsion from another district. If a student seeks to enroll in the district during his/her term of expulsion, the district shall request the school board of the former school district to provide a copy of the expulsion findings and order, a written explanation of the reasons why the student was expelled and the length of the term of the expulsion.

The School District of Iola-Scandinavia shall not discriminate in admissions to any school, class, program or activity or facilities usage on the basis of sex, race, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, religion, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, handicap or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
