

What are the consequences of receiving a responsibility slip?

- * Noon detention: Students report to a supervised detention room at the beginning of the lunch period where they will eat lunch.
- * 15 minute MASH(Mandatory After School Homework): Students need to be to the designated room on time with homework.
- * 30 minute MASH: Students need to be to the designated room on time with homework.
- * 2 hour MASH: Students need to be to the designated room on time with homework.
- * Administrative action: Suspension and possible mandatory parent conference.

Noon detentions are served on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 11:10 - 11:40 a.m. MASH detentions are served on Tuesday and Thursdays. **STUDENTS are responsible for notifying their parents when they need to serve a MASH. Students and parents are responsible for providing transportation home when the student has completed the appropriate MASH.**

What are Honor Levels?

The system offers various incentives to students on Honor Levels 1 and 2. Weekly, quarterly and end of year incentives may be awarded to these students.

Honor Level 1: 0 points: Students have all privileges and are eligible for all special occasions and incentives.

Honor Level 2: 1-10 points: Students have some privileges. They are eligible for rewards, however, there may be differences in special activities or incentives.

Honor Level 3: 11-20 points: Students are not eligible for special activities or incentives.. Students may not attend dances, athletic events, or concerts (unless participating in band or choir). Students may not leave study hall. If the student is in athletics, they may practice but may not be allowed to compete until they are back on Honor Level 1 or 2, based on the coaches discretion.

Honor Level 4: 21 or more points: Student loses all privileges except coming to school.

How do you get back to Honor Level 1?

The Honor Level System is forgiving. If a student receives a 1 point demerit responsibility slip and receives no more slips in the next 7 days, he/she will be back on Level 1. If they receive a 3 point or 5 point demerit responsibility slip, it will take 14 calendar days to get back to Level 1. **REMEMBER:** These are calendar days so weekends and vacations count toward the days back to Level 1.

This works for each time a student receives a responsibility slip. In other words, every 14 days, (sometimes 7), from the day of a responsibility slip the student receives that number of demerit points back. When a student is back on Level 1 they will receive a "Welcome Back to Honor Level 1" slip.

How do students know they have to serve detention?

Students will know they have to serve detention if a teacher collects their responsibility slip or informs them that they are receiving one. They will also be given a detention slip by their 1st hour teacher. **It is the student's responsibility to remember detentions, inform their parents and make arrangements for transportation home if it is a MASH detention.**

What is a MASH detention?

MASH stands for Mandatory After School Homework, which means students must attend the after school detention and must have homework to work on while they are there. Failure to show up for an assigned detention or failure to bring homework will result in receiving additional responsibility slips, additional demerits and the accumulation of more demerit points!
